Read on to learn about ways you can get involved in CTC.



## **Customized Employment**

## Customized Employment Continues to be Our Core Mission

We believe that with the right job and the right supports, everyone can work, no matter what their disability. Customized Employment (CE) is a collaborative, personcentered approach to employment services that is driven by the job seeker's specific skills, interests, talents, and support needs. CE is also aligned with the national Employment First initiative which states that employment in the community should be the first and preferred option for individuals with disabilities.

We piloted our Customized Employment initiative in 2016 with a single job seeker, and we are happy to



report that AJ, who lives in Hoffman Estates, has now been successfully employed by the Hoffman Estates Park District for over 18 months. Congratulations, AJ!

Using what we learned from our time spent with AJ and his family, we slowly expanded our efforts to include three additional job seekers, all of whom are now employed:

**CRISTINA** from Arlington Heights recently celebrated her one-year work anniversary at the Arlington Heights Memorial Library. Happy Anniversary, Cristina!





ALI from Palatine has not one, but two jobs—one at the Avalon Salon and Day Spa in Deer Park, and the other at The Grand at Twin Lakes. Way to go, Ali! **ANDREW**, who lives in Buffalo Grove, also has two part-time jobs—one at the Regal Cinema in Lincolnshire, and the other teaching art classes for the Buffalo Grove Park District. Great job, Andrew!



We are **GRATEFUL** to our two Customized

Employment Specialists, Beth Dowd and Dawn Goerger, who have each completed 40 hours of training and are certified in Employment Services. Beth and Dawn bring great enthusiasm and commitment to their roles as they spend at least 150 hours over the course of 8-12 months working with each job seeker in order to find the best vocational match.

We are also **THANKFUL** to the Rotary Clubs of both Palatine and Buffalo Grove for their support of this initiative through community grants.

## **Educational Outreach**

### Our Educational Outreach Initiative Continues to Grow

The goal of Educational Outreach is to provide area families, educators, and service providers with useful information related to the transition process and life in the community after educational entitlements end.

Educational Outreach has three components:

- Monthly FRIDAY FORUM seminars featuring a variety of disability-related speakers
- Monthly INFORMATIONAL TOURS highlighting different employment, residential, and day service models
- A day-long annual TRANSITION SUMMIT which allows us to address one topic in a more indepth manner

This year's Summit focused on employment, while our 2019 Summit will address housing. In 2017-2018, 260 different individuals attended one or more Educational Outreach events for a total of over 400 interactions.

THANK YOU to the Northwest Suburban Special Education Organization (NSSEO) for partnering with us on Educational Outreach, and to the



Hoffman Estates Commission for Disabled Citizens for co-sponsoring the Transition Summit again this year.

## Creative Day Services

### Part of Our Mission from the Beginning

When we founded CTC in 2013, Creative Day Services became part of our mission because, at the time, the only day programs in our area were sheltered workshops. It's all about having a choice, and by working to increase the number of **QUALITY PROGRAMS** in our area, we hoped that young adults with disabilities might have the choices they deserved in day services.

Flash forward five short years and three communitybased, creative day options have opened here in the northwest suburbs with more in the works. As advocates, we have enjoyed meeting with our area service providers in order to communicate the needs of our families, and we are thrilled that so many of them have recognized those needs and taken steps to fill them.

CTC will continue to be an **ADVOCATE** for creative day options until every individual is able to access day services that are right for them.

## Community Collaborations

## Creating Awareness and Expanding Dialogue

In partnership with the Northwest Special Recreation Association (NWSRA), CTC co-hosted a community event last fall featuring Greg Fenton, then Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities, Illinois Department of Human Services.

This event aimed to create an **AWARENESS** of existing issues within the state while expanding a dialogue between DHS and families. We were encouraged by the topics addressed at the event and look forward to **COLLABORATING** with NWSRA again, this time on the topic of transportation.

## **Service Opportunities**

### Our Collaboration with the Palatine Chamber of Commerce Continues!

Throughout the spring and summer months, our young adult volunteers help the Chamber prepare promotional bags, first by collating all the coupons, flyers, and brochures supplied by area businesses, and then stuffing the bags (over 1000 this year!) for distribution at various community events.

Service opportunities allow our young adults to give back to their community while building vocational skills. They're also a lot of **FUN!**

## Providing Opportunities through Microbusiness

In 2016 we started a small microbusiness called CTC Creations which allows our young adults to develop, make, and sell products while earning a competitive wage.



For the past two years, we have been making MASON JAR BROWNIE and COOKIE MIXES, as well as beautiful GIFT TAGS out of donated greeting cards and calendars.

Last holiday season we made and sold over 300 brownie jars and 20 of our young adults were paid for their work—a first for some of them.

Patty Terzich and Kathy Kotel did a fantastic job running CTC Creations last year, but they have chosen to step aside, so we are again **SEEKING VOLUNTEERS** to take charge of this wonderful initiative.
